# Version 3.0 (build 370); December 15, 2023

- Data Navigator
  - Importing data is now available in both "live" and demo modes.
  - Retooled to improve performance, especially for large data sets.
  - Added filtering of the data tree using metadata values as selections.
  - Added metadata favorites to the metadata review window.
  - The signal names also contain the user specified signal labels.
  - Tree structure is preserved when hiding / unhiding the window.
  - Added action "Discard Marked Paradigms" when the selection is on the experiment node and "Enable Marks" is enabled.
  - Mark properties of paradigms, routines and signals nodes are preserved.
  - Mark properties no longer depend on the GUI state of a node.
  - Added "Set Sweeps marks by Equation" and "Set Sweep Marks by Value List".
  - Added "Copy Routine Name to Clipboard" to handle international keyboard characters that have slight differences when using "Set Signal Marks by Name Match".
  - Added arrow key icons for navigating through the data tree nodes, shift click moves by node.
  - Added importing multiple files from a folder ("batch import").
  - Added sweep selector to review windows (Routine and Paradigm).
  - Added "copy to.." control to Metadata and Image Review.
  - Added controls to invert the selected image (vertically and horizontally) in Image Review.
  - Added "Extract Sweep to Template Pool in addition to using the marquee in the scope window.
- Paradigm Editor
  - Enhanced Paradigm step "Front Window" to include options to show/hide controls of the dPatch/IPA control panels and to show/hide the dPatch





monitors.

- Added settings icon with options to write paradigm steps to the notebook and settings for writing to the Metadata.
- Added "copy to.." control.
- Analysis to Notebook step uses the data export and scope title content preferences for formatting.

#### Preferences

- Added option "Start index" (0 or 1) to auto File Naming.
- Added option "A/C Line Frequency" to consolidate this selection from all the various windows.
- Added option to "Pre-allocate input and output buffers" to improve load time for routine execution.
- Added option "Title content" in Scope Window to allow showing experiment name (or HDF5 filename), paradigm name and routine name.
- Added option "HDF5 Format" to Data Export.
- Added new options for "File Control" to provide inter-application communication via text files for reading and writing to SutterPatch. All Paradigm Editor commands, other than flow control, are supported.

### Scope Window

- Timer value at start of selected sweep is shown in the scope depending on "Show Timer" preference setting.
- Added Power Spectrum (FFT) Plot.
- Added "Scan Signal Data" tool for scanning a specified signal, wave index, time and amplitude are displayed during the scan.
- "Show Previous / Next" series retains the active sweeps display mode.
- Added separate button for continuous auto scale.
- Modified continuous auto scale to update as needed to keep the signal in view, ~ 20% change from previous update.

#### Single channel analysis

- Added "skip" option to allow stepping over a stretch of data.
- Added "Show results in graphs" option to define whether the most relevant fitting results are shown in the graph.
- Added "Print Fit-Results to History" option to write extensive fit results to the history window.





## Synaptic Event analysis

- Added "Show Results Graph" to allow viewing results without having to open a layout.
- Added "Show Results Table" to view analysis results without having to open a layout.
- "Save Results" has been modified to add the results to the Analysis Editor as well creating a layout page.
- "Threshold Analysis" has been renamed to "Distribution Analysis" as the function has been reworked to allow any combination of results to be plotted.
- Added cursor info to "Distribution Analysis" window to scan data.
- Selection an event in the "Distribution Analysis" graph will update the event in the event list and in the sweep preview.

#### Action Potential analysis

- Added "Show Results Graph" to allow viewing results without having to open a layout.
- Added "Show Results Table" to view analysis results without having to open a layout.
- "Save Results" has been modified to add the results to the Analysis Editor as well creating a layout page.

## Acquisition Control

- Start Paradigm and Start Routine control remain active during Membrane
   Test and Free-run allowing paradigms and routines to be started while
   automatically terminating ongoing acquisition.
- Stop Acquisition control will now terminate all active acquisition, even when Stop of End of Sweep is enabled.

#### SutterPatch Notebook

- Retooled from standard text Notebook to formatted.
- Added graphic object support.
- Added print and save options (TXT, HTML or RTF).

#### Template Editor

- Added controls for resizing template waves.
- Dynamic Clamp Editor
  - Improved output for Copy to.. functions.





 Command Signal to AuxOut functionality can now be handled via the live CommandIn signal, eliminating the need for external connections.

#### · Routine Editor

- Start-to-Start time has been expanded to include using an equation, a value list, value + increment and routine variables, allowing flexible start-tostart times from sweep to sweep.
- Leak Subtraction has been expanded to include both P/N and Background Subtraction.
- Effective sampling rate / interval is shown for all input channels based on bandwidth and Nyquist settings (dPatch). For IPA same as the sampling rate specified in Routine Settings.

#### dPatch

- Dynamic Hold tau range list retooled to eliminate options that could cause oscillations.
- Added 2D dragger control to Rs Correction Prediction.
- Rs Correction and Prediction controls are renamed based on Feedback mode when combined correction and prediction is enabled.
- Added the line-frequency reduction type "subtract background" to Membrane Test for improved performance, especially for test pulse durations less than 50 ms.
- Added the ability to acquire the "live" command signals in both Membrane test and Free-run.
- Demo data: option to add line interference for testing LFR and background subtraction as well as to simulate "true" conditions.
- Demo data: emulation of bridge balance correction.
- Demo data: emulation of command signals, including the effects of Dynamic Holding.
- Added "Configure AuxOUT" for the Aux-OUT controls in the I/O tab to provide scaling and naming when interfacing with external devices, i.e temperature controller.
- Added Lock-in frequencies of 100 and 200 Hz in the Membrane Test.
- Added the option to open the Power Spectrum window when RMS noise Pulse type is used.



- Failure of any of the auto function is now indicated with a small red "E" in the respective controls.
- Added option to allow Membrane Test Pulse amplitudes of 0 mV and 0 pA.
- Improved performance of Membrane Test Repetition Interval with "Shortest Possible".
- Added user editable limits for amplifier auto functions (Offset, Electrode Compensation, Cell Compensation and Rs Correction).
- Added "copy to.." control to amplifier control panel.
- Added showing the Fit Trace in Membrane Test.
- Added "copy to.." control in membrane Test for writing results to either the Notebook or Clipboard.
- Firmware version 101, retooled USB packet communication for improved performance.

### IPA / DIPA

- Improved performance of Membrane Test Repetition Interval with "Shortest Possible".
- Current and Voltage monitors update during long continuous (Gap free)
  acquisition.

### Miscellaneous

- Synaptic Event and Action Potential Analysis windows retooled.
- Renamed menu entries "New HDF5 File" and "Update HDF5 File" to "New SutterPatch HDF5 File" and "Update SutterPatch HDF5 File" to match the menu entry "Open SutterPatch HDF5 File". The original naming could be mistaken for an HDF5 experiment file.
- The controls "Copy to Clipboard" and "Copy to Layout" have been replaced by a single popup control with these entries:

To Notebook (as text)

To Clipboard (as text)

To Clipboard (as graph)

To Layout (as graph)

Added "Sweep Time" to the special identifiers. The list now includes:

Time (present date-time, s)

Timer (timer time, s)

ParadigmTime (time at start of paradigm, s)

RoutineTime (time at start of routine, s)

SweepTime (time relative to routine start, s)





- Added SutterPatch Help Topics submenu to the Igor Pro Help menu to provide quick access to help topics.
- Added SutterPatch Online Manual entry to the Igor Pro Help menu to provide quick access to SutterPatch manuals.
- Added button to toggle between show and hide "Cursor Info", in the Scope, real-time analysis and Analysis Editor windows. This control provides easy access to the Igor Pro "cursor info" tool which can be used to place cursor(s) on any trace, get readouts of the x- and y-values and provide cursor regions for Quick Fit. The readout values are written to the notebook.
- Added USB support to SutterXOP to control Lambda 721 Wavelength Switcher.

- Stored Free-run acquisition would not create an acquisition routine copy if acquisition was terminated by closing the Scope Window.
- Dynamic Clamp setting copy was not properly stored in the HDF5 file.
- Notebook properly stored when using PXP experiment files.
- Virtual signals with math type Bessel Filter and Integrate did not properly handle P/N leak subtracted traces, main and leak pulses are now filtered individually.
- Removed Nan data points at the end of dPatch CommandIn and Auxiliary channels sweeps.
- Export type "Copy Data Waves to Igor Folder" exporting both 2D and 1D waves, and not user selection.
- G-Holding controls in the dPatch control panel were not disabling for active Hodgkin-Huxley and Markov conductance models.
- Updating the configuration pool for shortcuts, templates, solutions, camera, and dynamic clamp settings.
- IPA control panel I/O tab controls properly resized and updated.
- Improved IPA display compression.
- Partial sweeps selection with IPA amplifiers was not properly saving the partial sweep.
- Pause / resume for routine acquisition would fail, both demo and live mode.
- Certain conditions would cause the middle slider on the Triple slider controls, used in both IPA and dPatch control panels, to not update correctly.





- dPatch free-run acquisition the "Acquired: XX" value was not updated for the last acquired sweep.
- Certain continuous (gap-free) conditions with the dPatch could cause the last sweep to not fully complete.
- Export to Layout for membrane-test and free-run graphs were updating with the last acquired data trace. All graphs display the data set that was active during the export.
- Single channel analysis: incorrect levels would occur when the transition amplitude could not be estimated due to a short event duration.
- Reading metadata parameters (via identifiers in equations) during reanalysis was limited to the last change before the routine was acquired. Now the appropriate tag is retrieved.
- Metadata prompt window will no longer block the controls when a routine or paradigm metadata step is called from a planned paradigm.
- Metadata prompt will now terminate properly when canceled.
- HDF5 file write errors would occur when saving an acquired routine copy that included templates that were larger than 1 million points.
- ABF and PatchMaster data import would create acquired routine copies that required additional information. Additional prompts have been added for user interaction.
- Certain IPA routines created with SutterPatch version 2.2 and earlier would use the default input sampling interval when converted to a newer Routine structure.
- Single Channel Analysis Amplitude Distribution Plot CurveFit error.

#### **Known Limitations**

- This release requires Igor Pro 9.0 and above.
- Internal routine structure has changed which requires that routines be converted.
   Once converted they cannot be opened by older SutterPatch versions. You will be prompted to make a duplicate copy before the routine file is converted.
- For Windows 10 / 11: setting a display scaling factor greater than 100 % may cause strange "creeping" window behavior when the Set Preference option "Automatic window repositing" is enabled. A single click on the windows title bar will stop the creeping.
- Windows 10/11: windows updates tend to enable power management settings to go to "sleep" to save power. For USB internal Hubs this can lead to USB communication errors. To check this setting: start Windows Device Manager,





expand Universal Serial Bus controllers, select each USB Hub device, right click Properties, Power management tab, uncheck Allow the computer to turn off this device to save power. - MacOS: when the system is idle (no keyboard or mouse activity) for an extended period SutterPatch may become unresponsive (spinning beach ball), SutterPatch / Igor has NOT crashed, the system will recover. The time for recovery is somehow related to the idle time, the longer the idle time, the longer it takes to recover. Hiding Igor during these idle times will minimize this issue.
- The time required to save data for PXP experiment files increases based on the file size since the entire data set is rewritten. For large data sets using the option "Save separate HDF5 file" will drastically improve the saving performance since only the updated data is written.

- Paradigm step editor: added "select all" button.
- Added the "IF[..]" special identifier to the virtual trace equations.
- Added Execute Routine options "Membrane Test" and "Free-Run" with their respective parameter settings.
- Added several new settings to "Amplifier" step command for both IPA and dPatch amplifier series.

#### Preferences

- Added option "Use Scientific/Engineering format" to define the data formatting for data export, the notebook, analysis editor tables and copy to clipboard.
- Added option "Show time in Acquisition Control window".
- Added option to show preferences settings on startup.
- Added option "Copy to Igor folder".





- Added option "Write tags to notebook".
- Added options to enable " " separator in file names.
- Added options to save data waves as either single or double precision.
- Added Compact HDF5 file during shutdown process.
- Added Copy Data Waves to Igor Folder to Data Export for exporting to a user specified folder for use by custom procedures and functions.

## Scope Window

- Added Color Plot to visualize data.
- Retooled slider controls for improved performance.
- Single channel analysis
  - Added control "Channels open upwards/ downwards" to set proper amplitude limits.
  - Added cityscape mode to amplitude histograms.
- Acquisition Control
  - Non-continuous routine acquisition can be "Paused" and "Resumed".
  - Stop at end of sweep" option state is preserved.
  - Added Select Routine options "Membrane Test" and "Free-Run"

#### SutterPatch Notebook

- Dedicated notebook that is part of SutterPatch data set.
- Variety of entries can be automatically added to the notebook including:
  - Real time measurements and graph values.
  - Cursor coordinates from acquisition-, reanalysis-, review-scope, analysis window, analysis editor, template editor.
  - Graphs, tables, and any other object pasted from the clipboard.
  - User notes and paradigm results.

### · Routine Editor

- Expanded the maximal number of characters in the equations for segment amplitude and duration from 80 to 400 characters.
- Value Lists have been reworked to have the same round-robin behavior as templates, to minimize the need to specify individual values for each sweep.
- All comma separated equations are now checked for syntax errors.
- New analysis functions:





- Amplitude at absolute peak
- Amplitude at max
- Amplitude at min
- Amplitude at threshold
- AP duration 20% 100%
- Added options "time relative to sweep" and "time relative to region" to:
  - Time to absolute peak
  - Time to max
  - Time to min
  - Time to threshold
- Added sorting of routine pool in either ascending or descending order.
- Added option to store / not store the acquired series.
- Added option to "Save partial sweep".
- For dPatch added option to acquire the "Live" command signal.
- For dPatch added Bandwidth settings for command signals, both live and template copies, and for AuxIN channels.
- For the dPatch added controls for the new "In Sweep Actions" and for "Preloading the stimulus".
- For dPatch added segment waveform option "Constant" which will repeat
  the specified amplitude value without having to download x number of
  output points to the dPatch.
- Added options to select Input channel Recording Mode for situations when the parent channel is not physically connected to an amplifier channel.
- Added "To Notebook" options to Real-time measurement for writing individual results to the SutterPatch Notebook.
- Added and reordered acquisition information in the Preview section.
- Added option to scale a template within a routine.
- Added option to update an existing template in the routine from the Template Editor without having to first delete it.
- dPatch
  - Firmware version 93:
    - Command waveform signals can now be acquired.
    - Gap junction dynamic clamp mode for Hodgkin Huxley models.



- Command IN and Auxiliary input channels are digitally filtered based on Bandwidth and Nyquist factor settings.
- In Sweep actions for changing Recording Mode, Dynamic Holding and Holding within a sweep based on threshold or fixed time.
- Added command waveform preloading to minimize delays in starting Routine acquisition.
- Voltage and Current monitors on the control panel are now both acquired, which consider Dynamic Holding changes performed by the dPatch firmware.
- Timeout and maximum iterations used by the various auto functions can now be defined by the user.
- Added visual warning and automatic disabling of CC recording mode when an overload condition exists for more than 10 minutes when the amplifier is idle.
- IPA / DIPA
  - Added Liquid Junction Potential setting in IPA Control Panel.
  - Added Auto Bridge function.
- Miscellaneous
  - Added minimum slope to Action Potential Analysis.
  - Added multiple ADP level options (20 100%) in Action Potential Analysis.
  - SutterPatch functions are now tolerant with external functions that set a different home folder.
  - Camera control adding notes to images.
  - Analysis, Dynamic Clamp, Equation, Paradigm and Template Editors now have the same Pool and Files options as the Routine Editor.

- Tags within a Series are now correctly handled when Virtual Signals are added, deleted, or updated.
- Metadata
  - Recording holding values (potential, current, AuxOUTs)
    - All holding values are written on Routine start, even if they are not defined or acquired in the Routine.
    - Editing of holding values disabled.





- Entries for the holding potential or current now assigned to the correct headstage.
- Paradigm or Routine sequence numbers could be reset if a Metadata prompt was canceled.
- Metadata tags in the reanalysis scope were not properly displayed in concatenated view.
- Storing to HDF5 data displayed an error, however data were properly stored, when the routine had more than one sweep which was stopped during the acquisition of the first sweep with the option "Stop at end of sweep" enabled.
- Properly displaying all sweeps when reenabling persistence display during routine acquisition.
- X-axis range is now properly calculated when sweep time is displayed as minutes and hours.
- Membrane Test amplitude in CC-mode was incorrect when changing feedback range in the dPatch control panel.
- Eliminated border effects when filtering data of virtual traces.
- Resizing the lowest pane in the Analysis window could cause an Igor crash.
- PatchMaster import for signals that had variable sweep lengths would fail. P/N
  pulses are now added to main trace to match SutterPatch behavior.
- Setting dPatch Digital Outputs 11 to 16 would fail in some functions.
- Y-scaling was not properly defined for signals at scope pane 3 or higher when yscaling preference was set to "Use Last Y Scale".
- Slider controls failed to work properly due to a bug in macOS Monterey.
- dPatch Routine acquisition using filter bandwidths of 100, 300 and 500 Hz failed.
- Analysis Editor tables had empty columns which resulted in export errors.

- Windows 10/11: windows updates tend to enable power management settings to go to "sleep" to save power. For USB internal Hubs this can lead to USB communication errors. - Igor Pro 9 compatibility
  - Installers for both version 8 and 9 available.
  - Igor Pro 9 is more responsive when large data sets are acquired.
- Analysis Editor
  - Added new functions Import and Export Table as text.
  - Added column labels to analysis waves.
  - The Analysis editor table will show the column labels if the analysis wave was created with column labels.
  - The "Overlay" button is now active also when only one analysis wave is selected. All graphs related to that wave are overlaid.
- Data Navigator
  - Added Copy to Clipboard button to Metadata Review.
  - Added the routine actions "Concatenate Sweeps" and "Restore concatenated Sweeps".
  - ATF export uses the text formatting as defined by Preferences > Data Export.





- Added Import options

## HDF5 Files

- Added file menu option "Open SutterPatch HDF5 File" to open a new HDF5 data file without performing a "New Experiment" operation.
- The file menu option "New HDF5 File" stores data in a separate HDF5 file without creating an additional pxp file.

#### Metadata

- Stimulus holding values for all connected headstages are now written, irrespectively of whether or not a signal is acquired. That also applies to storing data from Free Run (available on dPatch only).

- Fixed issue with unexpected acquisition errors when holding was changed during routine acquisition. This issue only affected IPA series amplifier systems.
- Fixed issue with routine acquisition not stopping when Stop at End of Sweep was enabled
- Fixed auxiliary output channel scaling in Routine Editor when the Unit was not V or A
- Fixed issue with Dendrite recording mode settings when editing a headstage configuration
- Fixed Paradigm settings for executing a Membrane Test
- Fixed Metadata parameters associated with Virtual Signals > Sweep Average
- Fixed showing the tags in the review scope.
